



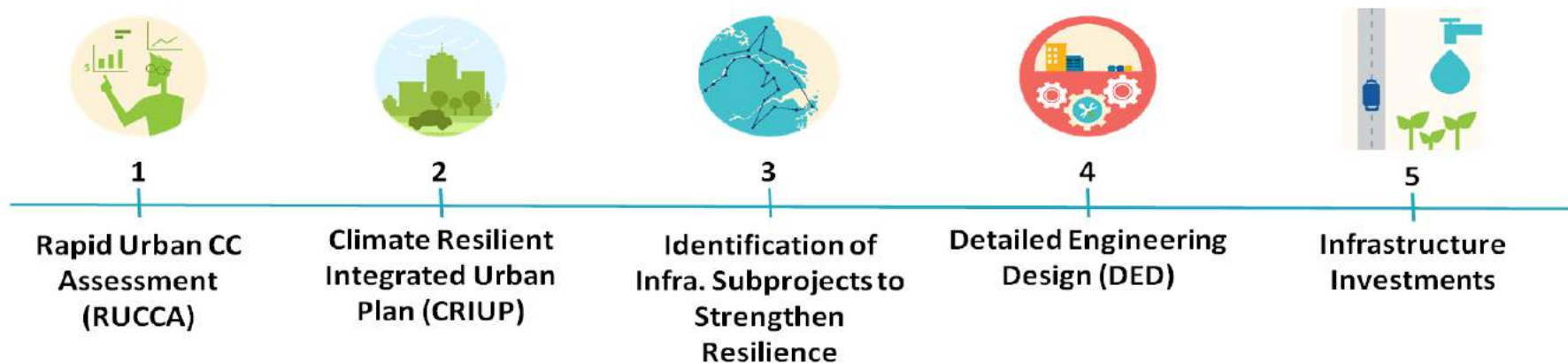

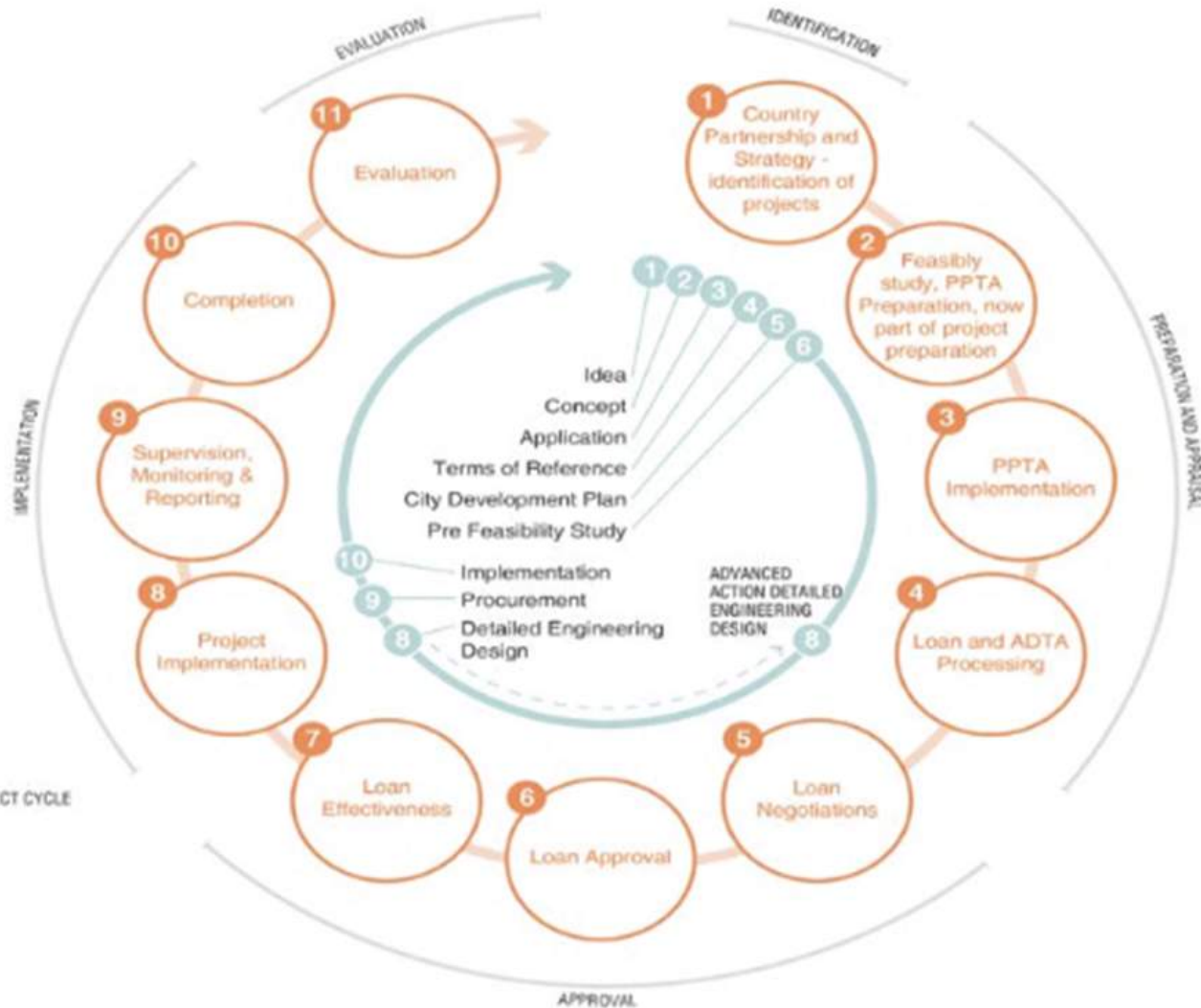
The Urban Resilience Fund

- Multi-donor financing partnership of the United Kingdom of Great Britain's Department for International Development (DFID), the Switzerland State Secretariat of Economic Affairs (SECO), The Rockefeller Foundation and the Asian Development Bank (ADB)
- US\$130M from 2013-2021
- Working with city planners & urban resilience partners in Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines and Viet Nam

The Resilience Lens to better design policies and infrastructure investments:



Reflective

using past experiences to inform future decisions



Resourceful

utilizing alternative ways to use resources



Inclusive

prioritizing broad consultation to create shared ownership in decision-making



Integrated

bringing together a range of distinct systems and institutions



Robust

constructing and managing well-conceived systems



Redundant

creating spare capacity purposively to accommodate disruption



Flexible

adopting alternative strategies in response to changing circumstances



Entry Points

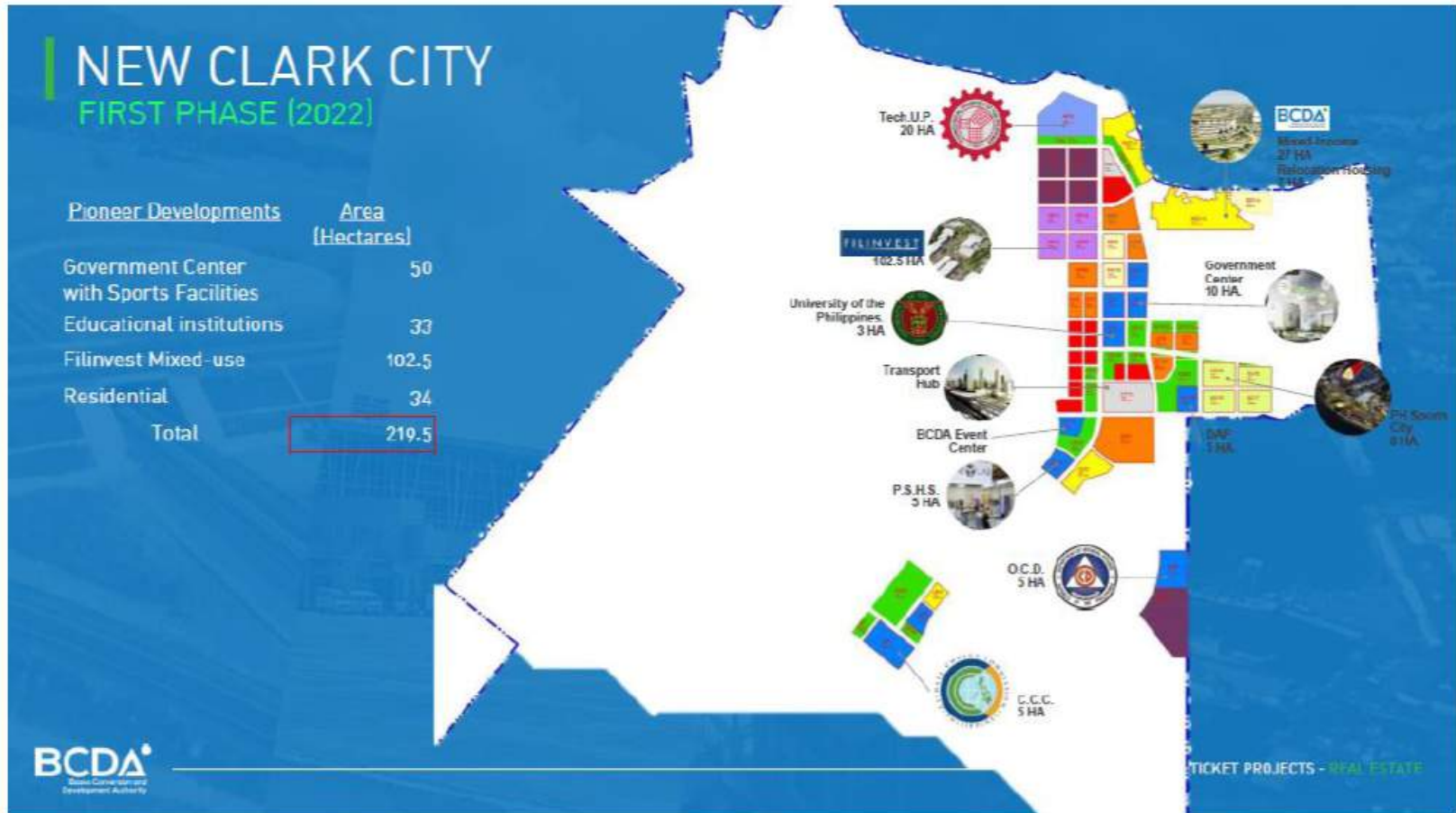

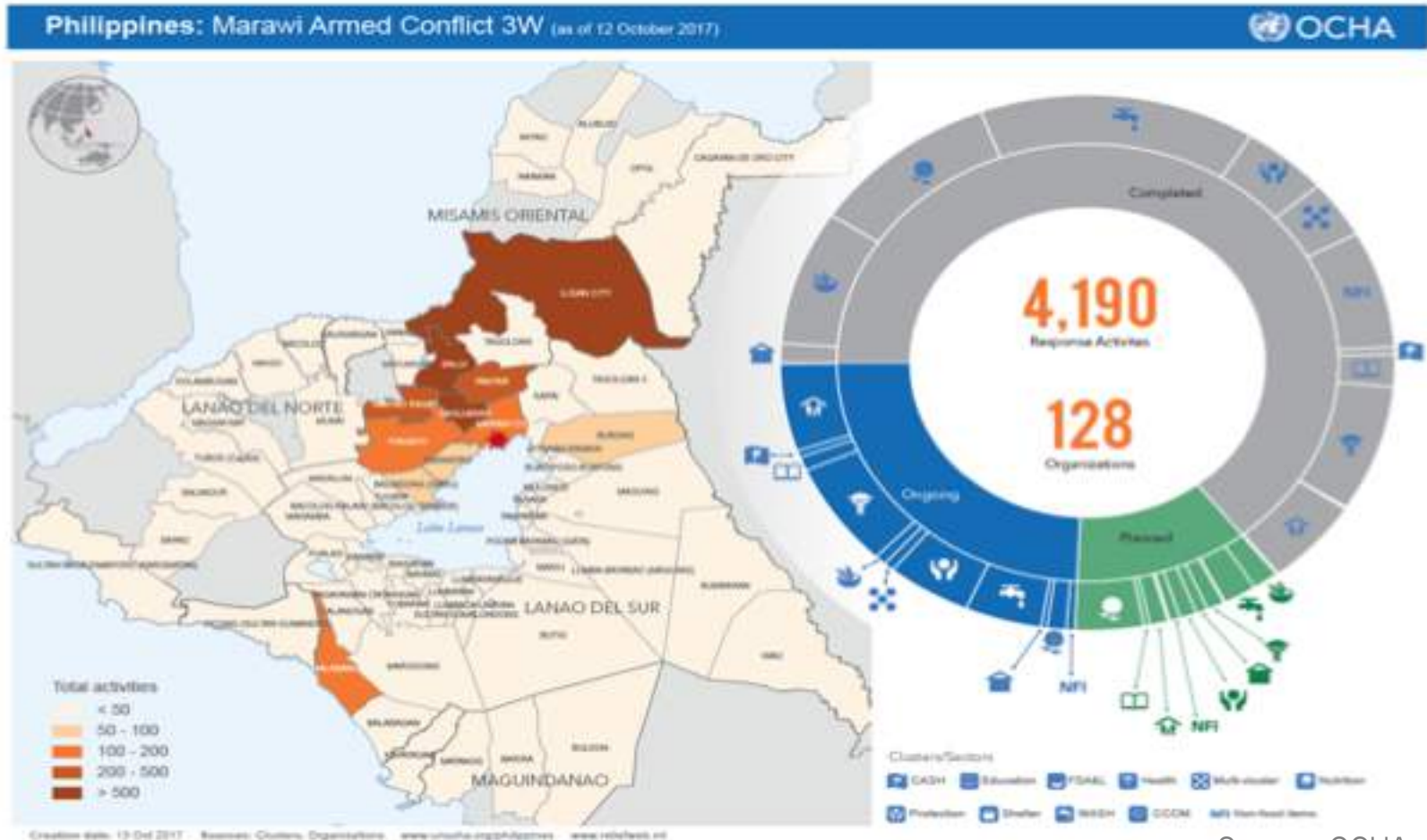
